Dear Siblings in Christ,

After a week of trying to level cabinets in a 50-year-old house whose floors have settled, I am convinced that life is a lot like leveling cabinets. As soon as you get one thing perfect, something else gets out

of whack. The front of the cabinet is finally level, but the back corner is off. The cabinet is level with the one beside it but the whole cabinet is not plumb, so it leans forward. Finally, you get it as perfectly as possible and you can't find your drill and screwdriver!

In life, we have things going well at work, but our house is a disaster because it has not been cleaned for a week (or more in our case!) Or our friends and family are finally all doing well but we missed an important meeting because we forgot to write it on the calendar. Unfortunately, the difficult balance of juggling many activities and issues in our lives means that we leave out something important. This is where I find many lapsed or inactive members of the congregation. It is not that they don't see faith and even worship as important, it is simply that they cannot seem to get it all in balance. So, we don't see them for months or sometimes even years.

The heart of the issue is that our lives will never be secure without being bound to Christ. When we allow our faith lives to weaken because we miss regular worship, we stop reading the Bible, our prayers are quick and not often enough, we end up with a life that might look good but has little stability. It is like the cabinets that have shims under and behind them—completely levelled and perfectly plumb but not yet screwed to the wall.

My prayer for you is that as you go through life, worry less about everything looking perfect and more about what you are deeply connected to. May each of you be well connected to Christ.

When you find that you are growing in faith, you will probably also realize that God is making you level and plumb too. Stay

connected! Let us, St. Mark Lutheran Church, help you stay bound to Christ. If you are unable to worship with us, let us know so that I can come and visit. When things are crazy in your life, let us know so that we can keep you in prayer and help you stay steadfast in your faith.

May Christ help you balance your life as you hold fast to what truly matters!

PRESCRIPTION FOR BETTER HEALTH



As America's percentage of overweight and obese people continues to rise, nutritionists and health care professionals tell us we need to eat better, reducing consumption of fatty and sugary processed foods, and increasing our intake of fresh fruits and vegetables. In fact, in Massachusetts and Maine, doctors are "prescribing" vegetables for low-income

patients, whose families are most at risk of being overweight. The doctors are giving coupons equal to \$1 per day per family member redeemable at farmers' markets for fresh produce.

It shows just how valuable doctors consider a varied diet that is high in nutrient-rich vegetables.

Stewardship of Life entails taking care of all of the gifts God has given us. Certainly, we all can take better care of our wonderfully designed bodies. Though no one enjoys perfect health, and many diseases and medical conditions are beyond our control, we can nonetheless do the best we can to minimize our risk factors.

A good diet and regular exercise go a long way toward keeping our bodies healthy, and that has many important ramifications. Physical health improves our energy and our attitude. It also keeps our medical costs low and improves longevity.

The folks in Massachusetts and Maine are helping low-income people to make fresh, local produce a part of their daily diet. It's a great idea that can benefit all of us.

For me, I can't get enough fresh, local tomatoes, cucumbers, peaches, and apples. What fresh, local produce is for sale at farm stands or grocery stores near you?


