February marks the middle of winter. The Church marks this by celebrating the Presentation of our Lord. On **February 2**, while everyone else is worried about how much light and shadow a rodent sees, we gather to remember that Mary's time of purification is completed, and Jesus is brought to the temple to be presented. Traditionally the church has blessed all the candles they plan to use for the year that day during Candlemas.

Since we mostly use oil filled candles now, we have never blessed our worship candles. However, I thought it might be nice to invite you to bring in any candles you plan to use this coming year for a blessing. I am sure many of you still light candles for certain occasions. The reason we still use candles for worship is to weekly remind ourselves that the light of Christ is among us. The season of Epiphany is a perfect time to focus on the light of Christ in our lives.

So, bring some candles to worship on Groundhog's Day this year. Let's celebrate Candlemas together and seek the light of Christ all year long!






