"To Know Christ and To Make Him Known"



Dear Siblings in Christ,

Every so often, someone will come to church at the

beginning of Advent and will be completely confused and sometimes upset that our lessons are not about Christmas or even predictions of Jesus' birth but about the end times. For most, Advent (if it is not just the beginning of Christmas celebrations) is only about getting ready for Jesus to be born. But in fact, we do not simply celebrate Jesus' birth, but we also look forward to Christ coming again every Advent.

But when we read the lessons about Christ coming again, many do not find them hopeful. They can scare us because they talk about the some of the terrible things that happen before Christ returns—wars and famines along with false prophets. They challenge us to be alert and watchful—which often implies danger and fear. Yet, the season of Advent is about HOPE, not FEAR. When we read the lessons closer, it is clear that Jesus is trying to warn us that bad things will happen but that these things are not the end. In fact, the end is a victory for Christians. It is the final victory of good overcoming evil.

The gospel message for Advent is when we experience evil in this world, we should not lose hope because there will be bad things happening until Christ comes again. But in fact, Jesus is coming back! In the meantime, the Holy Spirit is with us through those terrible times.

Come and join us for all the weeks of Advent. Do not be discouraged that the focus is on the end times. The end times are good. When you face any adversity, the beginning of the Church year reminds you that there is hope for the future. We—the people of faith—do not lose hope no matter what is happening in the world around us. We know the end of the story and rejoice every year because we peek ahead and see that God triumphs over all that is wrong in our lives and our world.

May your season of Advent be filled with Hope and Joy because it focuses you not only the first coming of Christ but also the final coming!

A MESSAGE FROM STEWARDSHIP



Advent & Exercising Good Stewardship of Our Spiritual Lives

When you say the word "Advent," what immediately pops into mind? A feast of color, a traditional manger scene bathed in soft candlelight, glistening snowflakes falling on festive trees, a yearning for the One who is to come. But sometimes, the season brings other images: crowded stores, treats that tempt us to too many calories, limitless to-do and to-buy lists. Yet in the back of our minds, we hear the call to conversion. Christ is calling us to be good stewards of all that we have and all that we are.

How can we keep Advent in such a way that it is a time to focus on the fundamentals of stewardship; of spiritual growth and preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ? Here are a few suggestions, not meant to be another to-do list, but rather a way to remind ourselves daily of our call to prepare a way for the Lord in our lives.

- Begin the season with a list to prioritize what you really want spiritually, and in relation to friends and family, from Advent. Discard all the "extras" and the fantasy of the perfect Hallmark Christmas. List clear goals that bring growth and peace and quality time.
- Take time to read the daily readings each day of Advent in your devotionals.
- Do you send Christmas cards? Even if they are the standard signature only or newsletter variety, try to personalize one a day, writing a nice note to an elderly relative or a friend you haven't seen in a long time.
- Pray for patience. As you drive over icy streets or navigate through a crowded store, take time to pray for those around you and for those who struggle with much less. Become aware of people around you and lift them in prayer rather than see them as obstacles to your goals.
- In the midst of a season of abundance, do not forget the poor in your community.

Over 335 neighbors, including 11 participants (Matt Yost, Cindy Larkin, Karen Heath, Katie Stull, Caroline Stull, Don Stull, Pastor Marleen Griffith-Stull, Amy Gimbel, Jonas Gimbel, Karen Fisher, and Jenny Batcheler [St. Stephen 1) who formed St. Mark Keller Street Walkers joined forces to raise over \$40,000 at the 2024 Mechanicsburg/West Shore CROP Hunger Walk held at Memorial Park on October 20, 2024, 100% of the funds will feed the most vulnerable locally through New Hope Ministries and Mechanicsburg Area Meals on Wheels and globally through Church World Service. Our team of walkers was one of 20 churches, 7 non-profit agencies, 3 Family/Friend groups and 2 businesses to "let their feet do the talking" to raise funds for the needy and help those in developing countries who walk an average of 3.7 miles daily to access water. Those who completed the 3-mile course were invited to enthusiastically ring a bell at the conclusion of the walk.

BROAD STREET ELEMENTARY SCHOOL - COMMUNITY DINNER Broad Street Elementary School recently hosted its annual Community Dinner. An idea that first launched in 2017, it has grown into an evening for families to come together, enjoy a good meal, talk, and get to know each other. The 2024 gathering was the largest yet!

Thanks to our community partners: First United Methodist Church, Mechanicsburg Brethren in Christ Church, St. Mark Evangelical Lutheran Church, and St. Paul's United Church of Christ for helping to provide the food, in addition to our Broad Street Girls on the Run Team who "chalked the walk" with welcoming messages, assisted with setup, and developed conversation starter questions, centerpieces from recycled materials, and games for families to play.

Also, a special #WildcatShoutout to our volunteers from Broad Street, from other MASD schools and the administrative offices, and throughout the community, our school social workers, and our very own Wildcat, who all helped to make the evening a success. We couldn't do what we do without our amazing community partners and volunteers.

St Mark participated in the dinner by donating 38 dozen rolls, 14 dozen cookies, 62 lbs. of apples, 8 bunches of bananas, and 5 bags of Clementine Oranges. There were approximately 300 people at the dinner.
