## Thank you Pastor Marleen Griffith-Stull!!



Dear Siblings in Christ,

Many of you know our Bible Study group is reading through 1 & 2 Samuel. In the early chapters of 1

Samuel, it is clear that Eli, the priest, is **not** the model of faith that we wish our faith leaders to be. Our first encounter with Eli is when he reprimands Hannah for being drunk. Eli has jumped to the false conclusion that Hannah is drunk because her lips are moving, she is obviously very emotional, but she is not saying anything aloud. Then we learn that Eli's sons have been unfaithful in their duties; he has done nothing to correct them. In contrast, Samuel is a great model of faith. His mother has dedicated him to God's service, and he has taken his role very seriously. It is to Samuel that God's Word comes, not to Eli.

Over the many years I have been in parish ministry, I have often witnessed lay members of the congregation who are better models of faith than myself. I do pray that I am doing a better job than Eli, especially with raising my daughters, but I know that in every congregation, there are many wonderful models of faith. I know that many members have been growing their faith longer than I have been alive and that sometimes younger members have a more genuine faith which is not clouded by life's unholy experiences. As Eli learns from Samuel how to live in faith, I am always humbled by people who teach me how to deeply listen for God's words.

I hope that you, like Samuel, are always ready to hear the voice of God. No, I do not expect many—if any—of you will actually hear God call you by name, but I do trust that God speaks to you in many ways. Unlike Eli, I hope that you recognize the voice of God whether it comes from your daily Bible readings, a sermon, a hymn, or an encounter with someone in daily life. My prayer is that when you do hear the voice of God, that you obey it. Remember this is sometimes hard. Samuel did not get an affirming message to share with Eli when he is first called by God, but he still faithfully shared what he received from God. Later in his life, he has many other difficult or dangerous things that he is called to do, yet he does them.

As you strive to be more like Samuel than Eli, there are many in our pews and in our community who witness what you do and say. May you be a model of strong faith for someone whose faith needs lifted!




